Otaru Canal

Otaru Canal was created by filling in the ocean side in 1923. There used to be many bridges over the canal, which supported the golden days of commerce of Otaru. The canal was improved and is now a tourist spot.

Shiraoi Ainu Museum

The Shiraoi Ainu Museum, also called Porotokotan, is one of Hokkaido's better Ainu Museums. Ainu culture and lifestyle is shown in an outdoor reproduction of a small Ainu village and inside a conventional museum building

Noboribetsu Hell Valley

An old crater created by an explosion about 10,000 years ago. Boiling water, water vapor and volcanic gas are emitted from deep in the ground

Noboribetsu Bear Park

There is a brown bear museum, the only museum of bears in the world, where you can study all about brown bears.

Orofure Pass

If you climb all the way up the sightseeing road connecting the Noboribetsu Spa and Lake Toya, you will reach Orofure Pass 930 meters above sea level. The observatory commands a magnificent view of the Pacific Ocean, Lake Kuttrara, Lake Toya and Mt. Yotei.

Onuma National Park

The nicest way to take in the scenery is to walk around the islands, which are joined by bridges. The view towards the 1133-metre jagged peak of the dormant volcano of Komaga-take is rightly considered to be one of the most breathtaking in Japan

Kanemori Red Brick Warehouse

The Kanemori Red Brick Warehouses were originally built in 1909 and remodeled in 1988 as part of a waterfront area redevelopment with a theme of "the old and the new". The area was where shipyards and foreign settlements were once located, but since about 1879 it prospered as a warehouse area. The Kanemori logo on these buildings once symbolized the trade-port of Hakodate

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
